A phased rollout for our Lion Account Users is April 15 – May 13. During this time, all current users will receive an email inviting them to access the new Lion Portal. If you do not see the email in your everyday inbox, please check all spam and junk folders before contacting LCI Member Support. The phased rollout is being done to ensure that staff will be available to provide the best support possible and offer a positive introductory experience.

DATES TO REMEMBER:

- NOW APRIL 11: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights will continue to function as normal.
- APRIL 12 and BEYOND: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights are no longer available.
- APRIL 15 MAY 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal sent via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users. User permission will NOT change. Those who currently can report service, access member data and other key functions remail the same.
- MAY 13 and BEYOND: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the NEW LION PORTAL.

I can just feel the anxiety levels rising!!! NOT another computer system rollout like the previous one. LCI has working hard to have this New Portal operating as designed and to create a positive experience for all Lions and Leos. If LCI, determines that more time is needed to ensure the systems optimal performance, the dates may be adjusted and we will be notified. State Convention Voting Delegation





January 3, 2024

Dear Lions Club Secretary:

Lions Clubs International has made a change to the Voting Delegate formula for Multiple District and International Convention elections.

Effective January 1, 2024 discounted members of a club are not included in the club delegate formula calculation. In order to be considered, the member must pay full dues.

(insert from LCI Board Policy Manual Chapter 17)

h. Discounted Member: A member of this club who pays discounted dues as a result of their family membership status, student status or participation in any other discounted membership program offered by the association who desires to retain membership in this club and meets the qualifications for discounted dues. The membership status shall be verified by the board of directors of this club. A Discounted Member shall have all rights of an Active Member but be eligible to hold office in district or international meetings, but shall pay such dues as the local club may charge, which dues shall include district and international dues. This membership category shall not be included in the club delegate formula calculation.

The discounted member may still be assigned as a voting delegate at both MD24 and LCI conventions.

The annual MD24 State Convention will be held at the Hyatt Regency Dulles April 18 - 21, 2024.

Delegate registration will begin in March. Instructions for registering your Club voting delegates will be provided with registration packages and will be posted on the MD24 and each District website as well as newsletters.

Discounted members may elect to switch to full paying members and will be considered in future delegate formula calculations if the membership change has been in effect for one year and one day from the day that the delegate list is released from Lions Clubs International. (Typically, one month prior to the convention.)

The current 1st and 2nd Vice District Governors shall be included as non-voting members and entitled to observe all deliberations and information exchanges of the COG and entitled to review and retain all documentation made available to the COG."

Rationale:

Ensuring the training of the future District Governors is an important task and opportunity for the Multiple District Council of Governors (COG). Additionally, decisions and activities of the Council of Governors affect not only their current year but can have lasting effects on their successors. Insights into those discussions and decisions is an important tool to the future district leaders. Furthermore, the International Constitution and By Laws provides "the multiple districts, by provision in its constitution and by-laws, to include certain other Lions as members of the Council of Governors." LCI Bylaws, Article XIII, Section 4 (By Laws, pg. 30) allows the inclusion of PDG, PID, PIP, PIVP as members of the COG. Finally, current procedures allow the sitting COG to determine the level of participation (prohibit, limit, or allow the inclusion) of the Vice District Governors on an annually determined basis.

If such time and place so designated shall become unavailable, for any reason, the Council of Governors shall re-designate a site and/or a new date.

Change to read: FUTURE ANNUAL STATE CONVENTION. The location of the Annual State
Convention four (4) two (2) years thence shall be recommended by a vote of accredited delegates before the close of
each Annual State Convention. Sub-Districts L, C and I will alternate hosting annual MD24 State Convention, with each
Sub District to host one annual convention, and with the understanding that any Sub District may decline hosting a
convention and the convention will be hosted by the Sub District next in line. At the following Annual State Convention,
the Council of Governors shall approve the recommendation and designate the site for the following State Convention. If
such time and place so designated shall become unavailable, for any reason, the Council of Governors shall re-designate a
site and/or a new date.

Rationale:

Timeliness and the ability to negotiate acceptable contracts is more difficult with 4 years before the event. Many venues are reluctant to negotiate that far out. Moving this to two years would increase responsiveness for Convention planning.

Section 1 - Council Chair Selection

- (b) The process by which the selection is made
- (iv) The council chairperson, shall be appointed by the District Governors of the multiple district provided that such chairperson shall be a current or past district governor when they take office. The council chairperson shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again. A meeting of the district governors of the multiple district who will be in office during the term of the council chairperson appointed shall be called following the multiple district annual convention, but no later than 30 days following the closing of the International Convention for the purpose of selecting a council chairperson. It shall be the duty of the attendees at this meeting to appoint a club member in good standing in a club in good standing in the multiple district as the council chairperson.

The Chairman shall be from the district in which the State Convention shall be held but will not be a member of the Council of Governors nor a member of the State Convention Host Club. In the event of a vacancy in the position, the Council of Governors shall fill such vacancy at its next regular or special meeting.

Rationale:

Non-profits are charged with ensuring no conflicts of interest exist. A member of the Council of Governors (DG or CC) whose Lions Club is serving as State Convention Host Club has a financial stake in items in which they are asked to vote on. A member of the Council of Governors (DG or CC) also serving as the State Convention Chairperson or in the State Convention Host Club presents a clear conflict of interest.

Section 1. AMENDING PROCEDURE. These By Laws may be amended only at a multiple district convention, by resolution reported by the Convention Committee on Constitution and By-Laws and adopted by the affirmative vote of a **majority of the delegates present in person**, registered, and voting on any question shall be the act of the convention of the delegates.

Rationale:

LCI C&BL requires a simple majority to approve amendments to the By Laws. Approving this proposed amendment will align MD24 with LCI.

Administrative Changes to MD 24 Constitution and By- Laws

Administrative changes to the MD 24 Constitution and By-Laws are allowed to correct errors and to update changes required by Lions Club International.

Four (4) administrative corrections are being made to the MD 24 Constitution and By-Laws which do not require a vote from convention delegates. For transparency the information is being shared at this time.

Future corrections made to our governing document will be posted to the MD 24 Lions of Virginia website - State and International Forms and Publications page. Please refer to Record of Changes document.

1. Constitution - Article VII - Elections - Section 3 Club Delegate Formula

Change - Insert paragraph prior to subsection (a)

Discounted Member: A member of this club who pays discounted dues as a result of their family membership status, student status or participation in any other discounted membership program offered by the association who desires to retain membership in this club and meets the qualifications for discounted dues. The membership status shall be verified by the board of directors of this club. A Discounted Member shall be eligible to hold office in district or international meetings, but shall pay such 52 dues as the local club may charge, which dues shall include district and international dues. This membership category shall not be included in the club delegate formula calculation.

Reason for change - required by LCI Board of Directors - mandatory change effective January 1, 2024.

2. Constitution - Article IX - Financial Accounting - Section 1 Per Capita Tax

Change - Insert Student Dues prior to subsection (a)

For student membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, eligible student members shall pay a per capita annual tax equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount of dues as provided in sub-section (a) above with disbursement to also be one-half (1/2) of designation for full membership dues.

Reason for change - This section was inadvertently left out of the MD 24 Constitution and By-Laws adopted at the 100th annual MD24 State Convention April 2023.

3. Constitution - Beginning Page 15 - 19

Due to error duplicating Article Vii on pages 11 and 15, beginning with page 15 all Articles will be renumbered. The index on pages 2 - 3 will reflect changes.

Reason for change - Cannot have duplicate Article numbers.

4. By-Laws - Article II - Appointment of Council Chairperson - Section 1 (a) (i) page 21

Currently reads: A candidate for the Council Chairperson position must be an active member in good standing and a Past District Governor when he takes office.

Change to read: A candidate for the Council Chairperson position must be an active member in good standing and current or Past District Governor when he takes office.

Reason for change - current subsection directly contradicts page 21 Article II - Appointment of Council Chairperson.


